Hans-Dieter Klingemann

"Where do we come from, and where do we go? Institutional, theoretical, and methodological developments in political science since 1990"

Three aspects of the development of Political Science since 1990 are discussed. The first part reports some general theoretical and methodological trends. It concludes that ideological "either – or" positions are declining while eclecticism and rapprochement are on the rise. Second it is proposed that the research agenda is increasingly characterized by the importance of major comparative projects. These projects support work on particular substantive themes. At the same time they generate empirical data that are shared with the academic community. Covering longer periods of time such projects are major agenda-setters political science research. Three such projects are selected and discussed paradigmatically. The third and last part of the talk focuses on the development of Political Science as a discipline in Europe. It shows that the number of political scientists and their institutional base is growing as is the degree of supra-national cooperation.

Peter Mair

“How Parties Govern”

Although it is generally seen as desirable that parties in government are both responsive and responsible, these two characteristics are now in increasing tension with one another. Prudence and consistency in government, as well as accountability, requires that governments conform to external constraints and past legacies, and not just answer to public opinion, and while these external constraints and legacies have grown in weight in recent years, public opinion, in its turn, has become harder and harder for governments to read and process. Meanwhile, because of changes in their organizations and in their relationship with civil society, parties in government are no longer in a position to bridge or ‘manage’ this gap, or even to persuade voters to accept it as a necessary element in political life. This problem is illustrated by extensive reference to the current fiscal crisis in Ireland, and is also used to question some of the assumptions that are involved in principal-agent treatments of the parliamentary chain of delegation.
